It was here that MMF found its footing in the world of healthcare support. Under his guidance, this support was extended to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), and this mission continues today—honoring the systems he helped build for the benefit of the most vulnerable patients.

As all at MMF and FIL mourn his loss, this is also a time to celebrate the life of an extraordinary individual whose compassion knew no bounds. His influence will forever remain a part of MMF and the lives of those he served so selflessly.

Agreement inked to benefit 2000+ children across Padra Block.

In an exciting new development, Mukul Madhav Foundation is partnering with Learning Links Foundation (LLF) with a vision to prepare young adolescents for the 21st century and their post-school lives ahead. On 17th September an agreement was signed for the Road to Livelihood Program, in the presence of Mrs. Ritu Prakash Chhabria and team MMF, alongwith Ms. Nuriya Ansari and Mr. Dibyayan Datta representing LLF - a not-for-profit organization that works to improve education and support social innovation in India.





This project aims to equip 2000 students across 5 schools in Padra Block with essential 21st-century skills that include competency in Information and Communication Technology, boosting spoken English skills, and providing them with comprehensive guidance and counseling, so that each of them can identify and achieve their career goals.

Project launched to impact 5339 students in vulnerable communities across Mumbai.

On 29th August, a significant collaboration between the Mukul Madhav Foundation (MMF) and the Rangoonwala Foundation (India) Trust (RFI) was formalized in the presence of Mrs. Ritu Prakash Chhabria, Managing Trustee of MMF, along with her team, and Mr. Asif Rangoonwala, Trustee and Founder of RFI, alongside RFI trustees and team members. The partnership aims to implement a six-month pilot project designed to support students and other beneficiaries in vulnerable communities across various regions in Mumbai, including Andheri, Malad, and Kandivali.

1. Work with Children: Targeting 5,189 students and 250 teachers, the project will provide a range of center-based, school-based, and community-based activities focused on life skills and environmental awareness.
2. Work with Teenagers: Engaging 150 young adults and 120 parents, the project will guide first-generation learners towards higher education options, helping them make informed decisions.

Besides this, the project will also look to empower 1,600 women with parenting guidance, health awareness, and mental health support; offering 1,180 elderly participants regular social activities, cultural sensitization, and yoga training; and engaging 720 youth in vocational training through certified training in MS Office, Typing, DTP, and Tally, recognized by Maharashtra Business Training Board (MBTB) and the Skill Development and Vocational Training Institute of India (SDVTII).





145 students attend health camp at Pune school.

On 30th August a Health Camp was conducted at Dr Kalmadi Shamrao High School, a Kannada Medium school in Pune, in collaboration with doctors and staff from Bharati Hospital and H V Desai Eye Hospital. A total of 145 students in the age group of 13-15 years were screened, along with informative sessions on health, hygiene and nutrition. Prescriptions were handed over to the respective class teachers. Out of the 145 students, 43 were referred for refraction, 5 were referred to Pediatrics, 7 to follow-up with ENT, and 92 were suggested dental treatment. One 14 year old girl who complained of chest discomfort was administered urgent treatment.



MTech scholarship students enter 2nd year.

Mukul Madhav Foundation as CSR partner to Finolex Industries Limited, has been supporting the education spectrum since its inception as part of the vision of its founders. With scholarships given in India and overseas to students in multiple streams. Some scholarships are dedicated to Agriculture through Agriculture College, Nursing through Lila Poonawala Foundation, Laboratory Technology through BEL AIR, and STEM scholarships at Kings College London.

Since 2023 MMF/FIL have also been supporting 20 engineering students pursuing their M Tech (2023-25 batch) at College of Engineering, Pune.

These students have been selected under the Late. Smt. Mohini Pralhad Chhabria scholarship. As the scholarship enters its second year, an interaction was organised on 6th September between the student beneficiaries and team members of MMF and FIL.

Mr. Pradeep Vedula President Sales and Marketing – Finolex Industries Limited, along with Mr. Babalu Mokale and Mr. Kiran Chaugle from Mukul Madhav Foundation shared insights and encouragement with the students, while applauding their progress towards their dreams. The students in turn expressed their gratitude for the support. This session was conducted in the esteemed presence of Dr. D.N. Sonawane Registrar COEP, and Dr. M.R. Shindikar Incharge of Scholarship & HOD.




'70 child-friendly villages' Project launched to keep vulnerable children in school.



Circumstances in many parts of India, push little children into vulnerable situations that expose them to toil, violence, trafficking, substance abuse and other perils. Lack of employment for the parents, and absence of livelihood skills often force families to pull their children out of school, and in extreme cases, send them to work to supplement family income, or arrange a marriage to reduce the financial burden.

In response to this ground reality, Mukul Madhav Foundation as CSR partner of Finolex Industries Limited signed an agreement on 3rd September with British Asian Trust to mitigate these circumstances. This agreement was signed in the presence of Mrs. Ritu P. Chhabria Managing Trustee Mukul Madhav Foundation, Mr. Bharat Visweswariah Executive Director (India) BAT, Mr. Hiten Mehta, Ms. Shreen Vakil, Team BAT and Team MMF. The project plans to build community leadership to address issues related to child well-being; ensure safety nets for child protection; build economic resilience of the poorest families by linking them with relevant social security schemes; build relationships with critical government stakeholders; and upscale the impact of community-level initiatives for systems change at the district-level. With an initial focus on making 70 villages child-friendly.



Sexual & Reproductive Health Education Program launched in Gadchiroli.

On 13th September, Mukul Madhav Foundation as CSR Partner to Finolex Industries Limited signed an agreement with SEARCH Organization to launch a Sexual & Reproductive Health Education Program that will impact 12000 youth from various colleges, 6000 parents and 15000 tribal adolescents in ASHRAM Schools in all 12 blocks of Gadchiroli. The agreement was signed in the presence of Mrs. Ritu P. Chhabria Managing Trustee – Mukul Madhav Foundation, Dr. Abhay Bang Director, SEARCH, Dr. Rani Bang Co-director, SEARCH, Mr. D. V. Iyer Company Secretary Finolex Industries Limited and Team MMF.



Boarding costs support for 260 resident students in Rajasthan.

On September 14, 2024, Mukul Madhav Foundation and Finolex Industries Limited signed an agreement with Rashtriya Balkalyan Sansatha (RBKS) Rajasthan that will effectively improve the health, nutrition and allied aspects crucial in reducing drop-out rates amongst the tribal girls in Jhadol, Rajasthan.

The agreement was formalized in the presence of Mrs. Ritu P. Chhabria, Managing Trustee of Mukul Madhav Foundation; Mr. Girja Shankar Ji, CMD of RBKS; and Mr. D.V. Iyer Company Secretary Finolex Industries Limited and Team MMF.

Since 2019, MMF/FIL has been supporting RBKS in addressing various education-related needs for these tribal girls. This year this support will cover mess charges, maintenance costs, and miscellaneous expenses, including toiletries, for 306 individuals (260 students residing in the hostel at Jhadol and 46 staff members).



402 college students screened for Thalassemia.

Mukul Madhav Foundation, in collaboration with Finolex Industries Limited as their CSR partner, organised a Thalassemia and Diabetes awareness sessions at Maratha Mitra Mandal on 24th September, and at Government Polytechnic College on 25th September with total attendance of 552 and screening of 402. This was done with the coordination of Dr Nita Munshi (Thalassemia Society of Pune chapter) and Dr. Neelima Nagarkar (KEM Hospital).

MMF/FIL began to actively promote Thalassemia and Diabetes awareness across Pune, Satara, Ratnagiri, and Jalgaon in October 2023. Since then over 4000 students have been reached through awareness sessions, over 3200 tests at 19 colleges have been conducted. Identifying 52 students with minor Thalassemia and other conditions like anemia, sickle cell disease, and diabetes.
