Financial Overview

The project aims to provide financial assistance for blood transfusions to patients in Vadodara.

The total project amount is Rs. 5,07,200/-

The cost per patient's blood transfusion is INR 1490/-which consists of:

The details of the warriors, vouchers, and 80g were shared during the first week of each month. Currently, only the February and March data are amounts owed. This information will be forwarded to MMF according to the allocated date.

The project aims to provide financial assistance for Chelation medicine to patients in Dahod and Vadodara.

The total project amount for Dahod is INR 6.01,980 /-

The final cost allocated to the MMF is INR 5,41, 980/-Monthly Cost to MMF for 20 Children Medicines = Rs. 45,165/-

From April 2024 to March 2025 – 12 months cost will be Rs. 5,41,980/- for Medicines

From April 2024 to March 2025 - 12 Months of Administration cum Courier Cost = Rs.12,000/- (Per Month Rs 1000/-).

Final Project Cost to MMF = Rs. 5,41,980/- + Rs. 12,000/- = Rs. 5,53,980/- for April 2024 to March 2025.


The last quarter of the Dahod project is remaining which will be in March and after that, TWF will share the Update.

This aim of this Project is to support Thalassemic children in maintaining optimal iron levels and to contribute to the well-being of Thalassemia Warriors, enabling them to lead healthier and more fulfilling lives. Many individuals affected by Thalassemia face significant challenges in accessing essential medical resources due to financial constraints and limited availability. This is particularly critical for those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds who struggle to afford necessary treatments.


Our Founder had envisioned the role and support of MMF in running his Centers long before it came into existence... wherein Partth requested MMF for OPEX.

We are grateful thet MMF- FINOLEX's executive leadership agreed and gave consent to our request for adoption of Dahod too.....

Impact Assessment





T H A L A S S E M I A in a lively and interactive space which is inviting and stress free unlike any hospital kind set up.



We used a pragmatic parallel comparison design (not in the literal sense but by superficially talking to them through our sister [nurse], resident doctor, project coordinator, and Mr. Rajesh Thakur) with a comparison to warriors receiving transfusions at other centers in Vadodara and those in Dahod and nearby areas. We have, in total, five prominent facilities in Vadodara: BAGH, Red Cross, Kashiba Children's Hospital, and GMERS/SSG (government hospitals), for a total of approximately 230-250 warriors.



Mothers or caregivers were randomly spoken to for basic socio-demographic information and then followed up a couple of months later for detailed telephonic surveys.

There were two phases in our zeal to expand our base in Vadodara and not for a report writing to you. We also found that TWF needs to expand and felt the need to assess its standing in the market when 200-odd warriors are opting for these 5 facilities and the reasons for their choice over one another.



Deep Route Findings









- That the most important aspect in chronic diseases/disorders is the ACKNOWLEDGEMENT from family and friends which brings either a positive or negative impact on the overall health of the sufferer and especially in Thalassemia a lot needs to be done in this regard.
- That the Psychosomatic disorders too start creeping in, and play a vital role in the gradual deterioration in miscellaneous organs performance levels.
- The mental health counseling of parents, family, friends, and carers will always be a critical factor, particularly in our Dahod Centre.
- Even though science is rapidly developing methods to improve the effectiveness of chelation medications, following the recommended course of action is crucial for lowering ferritin levels.

EXIT INTERVIEW v/s NEW ENROLLMENT:

Starting with the New Enrollment first- Whenever a new warrior enrolls at TWF, by habit we too observe his discipline, compare his clinical versus medicinal reports, the behavioral patterns of parents within themselves, with their ward, and with other warriors, etc for a couple of transfusions and then only we put them up under any adoption scheme. This practice has helped us immensely as not only it inculcate our values, ethics, and especially a sense of belongingness as a community in them but it develops a fondness with our core team. Secondly, that discipline thing helps them feel that this is not just another hospital where they have to go for a transfusion only..... it's much more than that - TWF is a FAMILY - so what if it just comprises 5 members:

Sustainability









Thalassemics have an average life span of 25-30 and this has proved time and again despite the best practices followed in the management protocols:

Adequately Chelated - to keep Serum Ferritin levels of around 1000

Optimal Transfusions to keep pre-transfusion Hb of 9.5

We have observed that something of the other goes wrong. Those whom we say in the age brackets of 35-40 are mostly either the cases of Intermedia later got converted to Thal Major or exceptional cases which some other variants of Thal. Major(however we may not have clear reports to substantiate our findings) but by and large our understanding is very similar to those of many researchers available on Google.

The point we want to highlight here is that

- They will require BT every 15/21 days
- They will require branded chelators to keep the health status checked
- Mental health in those belonging to poor socioeconomic conditions.
- Education to all of them for confidence and self-love
- Acknowledging them for inclusion from Society at large
- Community building exercises biannually
- Strength-building events at least 2 in a year

The important and ignored areas are:

Endocrinologist: between the ages of 11 to 14

Radiology - Dexa and T2 Star every year after 12

Bone density and arthritis- between 15-18

To continue these initiatives, all of these need a wider perspective, greater philanthropic funding and a large team as an NGO... We are currently only meeting the most basic demands; the following phase may take a more comprehensive approach, focusing on building strength after strength.
